The Instructional Program and the School:

Chapelgate Christian Academy (CCA) is a private, college preparatory middle/high school with grades six through twelve. The school, founded in 1991, has a 2009 –2010 population of 399 with 305 students in high school. CCA integrates a Christian worldview into the entire curriculum.

The academic year is comprised of two semesters with two marking periods each. All courses are full year courses. Advanced placement courses are available in English, Calculus (AB and BC), European History, US History, Government and Politics, Biology, Chemistry, and Physics. Honors courses are available in English 10, English 11, Spanish IV, V, and French IV, V.

The Community:

Chapelgate Christian Academy is located in Howard County, Maryland, about 12 minutes west of Baltimore, in the rolling hills of central Maryland. The families in the area comprise a very stable community of predominately middle class professionals with high academic values. Approximately 200 churches are represented by the student body.

Special Features:

Students in grade 12, who have met the graduation requirements, may participate in a release-time, career-related, mentor program for credit. In addition, qualifying seniors may enroll in local colleges for special course work. Service projects are available to all students during the day. Students also have opportunities to participate in mission and educational trips abroad. Chapelgate has a chapter of the National Honor Society.

Grade Point Average:

The grade point average (GPA) is computed at the end of the junior year and is based upon grades in all subjects grades 9-11. The GPA is based on a 4.0 scale and is weighted. Advanced placement (AP) courses are given an extra weighted grade of 1.0. Honors courses give an extra weight of .5. GPA is computed by multiplying each credit (or part of a credit) by the quality points: A=4.0; B=3.0; C=2.0; D=1.0; F=0. The quality points for AP courses are A=5.0; B=4.0; C=3.0. The sum is divided by the number of credits attempted. The lowest numerical equivalent for letter grades is A-90; B-80; C-70; D-60. CCA does not assign a cumulative GPA to students who transfer into the school after the first semester of their junior year.

Rank:

We do not rank due to the diversity of our student's academic selections. Additionally, our smaller class size may not truly reflect the academic standing of the student or the difficulty level of courses selected.

Accreditation:

CCA is fully accredited by the Middle States Association of Colleges and Secondary Schools and the Association of Christian Schools International (ACSI). This is a 5-year dual accreditation extending through May 2011.

The Graduates:

Fifteen classes have graduated from CCA. Over the past five years about 56-71% of our graduating classes attend four-year colleges and approximately 22% to 37% attend two year colleges and many go on to four-year colleges. Generally over 95% of CCA graduates attend college.
