Symphonic Band

Because band presents unique challenges regarding aerosols and air flow, **CCA will be providing specialized PPE for all wind players** and their instruments (specialized masks, bell covers, clarinet/sax "bags", disposable condensation rags for brass players, etc.)

Anyone concerned about the safety of playing a wind instrument is welcome to switch to percussion or violin indefinitely until the student and their family choose to resume wind instrument playing.

If you are a true beginner: Due to the need for specialized PPE and the inherent challenges of starting a new instrument in a group setting, only those who have already had instruction (at CCA or otherwise) may play wind instruments. New members who are true beginners must **choose between percussion and violin** until we are able to play 100% in person without PPE.

Anyone switching to or playing these instruments will need to provide their own supplies.

Violinists must rent or purchase a violin.

(Limited violins are available to borrow and those who played violin last year will be given priority.)

o All drummers are required to supply their own sticks, mallets, and drum pad for use in class.

Studio Art is designed to support the independent artist. Though supplies are available in the Art Room, students might want to provide their own in lieu of the virus. Canvases and paper are both available from the Art Room. Since art materials are very expensive, I suggest they be voluntarily purchased on a “needs-be” basis. As an overview, the following are some suggestions in case artists want to come prepared ahead of time:

1. Professional Markers (not **Crayola!**)
2. Thin, permanent markers
3. Drawing pencils, a variety of B-H
4. Tortillion Stumps
5. Chalk Pastels
6. Colored Pencils (Professional Grade, **Prismacolor** suggested)
7. Oil Pastels
8. Chalk Pastels
9. Acrylic Paints
10. Oil Paints
11. Watercolor Paints (Professional Grade in tubes)
12. Variety of brushes for each of the above media
